Furthermore, like many students, I do very little work throughout the year and then try cramming insanely to pass my exams (for the record I did a 1-year intensive legal conversion course consisting of Seven three-hour exams. I do not recommend this technique for such a course. Or any course for that matter). I will write this detailed review as I will feel helpful myself when purchasing the guide. The quality of Nutshells books varies depending on the author. While they can sometimes be a little careless, with some typing errors and poor spelling, I can categorically state that I won't do well in my exams without them. THE GREAT course books that students give at the beginning of the year are terrifying and very difficult to revise effectively. While this information is useful and necessary for extended essay writing; for revisions they do not help. The fact that Nutshells books are short and concise means you can quickly gain a broad understanding of a topic. However, usually the teacher will warn you that while this can be useful, you should always be more thorough in your revisions. The question you want to know is, of course, can I pass the exam by just studying the Nutshell guide? Regardless of what the teacher might say to you, the answer is 'yes'. Your grades won't be outstanding, but given you learn your topic well and REALLY UNDERSTAND the law, you will definitely pass and may be able to get 2:1 compliments/ (this, frankly, will depend on where you learn). However, if you want to get higher grades (first, differences etc.) you should go beyond the content in this guide and do in-depth case law and academic reading. Their brevity sometimes (not often) means important cases are ignored or only mentioned in the pass and once or twice in my exams, I am actually caught here. I would therefore recommend you go back to your personal syllabus and look at past papers to see which questions might arise that are not fully covered by the book. When the books cover many cases in a nutshell, I find them very helpful for problem style exam questions. On the other hand, due to a lack of analysis and academic opinion, they are not very helpful for essay questions. Another limitation I found is that the guide is not very up-to-date with recent case developments. Land and Equity Law Book & The trust dates back to 2013, for example, so make sure you check the publishing date of the book you purchased because you definitely don't want to revise from a 5-year-old textbook. In conclusion, the Nutshells series really saved behind me, and I just wish I bought it at the beginning of the year and not in the end. They are certainly NOT perfect (hence 4 stars), but they really are a very effective way to learn a lot of information quickly. If you equip them with good all-round revisions, you can achieve strong scores. But if you don't, your understanding of the law should remain good enough for you to pass comfortably.
